Ms. Ryan Sawyer, Crystal Geyser I live at 503 Ski Village Drive, very close to the plant. I am concerned about noise levels when the plant goes into operation. One thing the EIR does not cover in detail is the noise the plant will generate. These fans, compressors, and other equipment are going to make a lot of noise. I suffer from tinnitus from 20 years of military service working on Aircraft (Master Sgt. USAF Ret.) and the constant ringing in my ears could be worse with the start up of the plant. I hear some hammers and other tools being used at Erickson Trucking and other shops across the street from you, but its occasional and not the constant whine of equipment that the CG plant will generate. After my military service I worked for BART (Bay Area Rapid Transit) in the Power/Mechanical section. We worked on a variety of equipment to include line fans, very big HVAC equipment, and all types of compressors. All this equipment can be sound insulated. Sound walls, insulated cylinders, and other noise suppression equipment can be installed to lower noise significantly. You have a lot of neighbors. Please consider installing noise suppression equipment for the safety of all nearby residents. The hearing health of everyone within a mile, and especially within a half mile I believe will be impacted by Crystal Geyser operations unless serious noise suppression is installed. Tinnitus is not a fun ailment to have and if Crystal Geyser goes into operation without very good noise suppression, I wont be the only one in the neighborhood with Tinnitus.
