WHEREAS, CARB developed the FARMER Program to meet the Legislature's objectives and help meet the State's criteria, toxic and greenhouse gas emission reduction goals; and

WHEREAS, the District did not receive a direct allocation of FARMER funds and is instead part of the FARMER Program's Shared Allocation Pool (SAP); and

WHEREAS, all SAP districts are required to execute a Master Agreement with Placer County Air Pollution Control District (PCAPCD), the FARMER Program's SAP Administrator, which outlines the programmatic requirements, policies, and procedures of the SAP FARMER Program, in order to participate in the Program; and

WHEREAS, all SAP districts are required to execute an Allocation Agreement specific to each funding allocation they would like to participate in, which outlines allocation-specific deadlines and other information; and

WHEREAS, the District will review project eligibility, submit projects to PCAPCD for review and award, and submit required reporting associated with the FARMER Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the District Board of Directors (District Board) hereby authorizes the Air Pollution Control Officer to execute the FARMER SAP Master Agreement; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the District Board hereby authorizes the District to execute the FARMER SAP Allocation Agreement for the CARB FY 22-23 FARMER SAP funding allocation, and for any subsequent funding allocations, and to accept any associated FARMER SAP funds allocated to District in future years; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the District Board hereby authorizes the Air Pollution Control Officer to negotiate, sign, and amend as needed, agreements and contracts related to administration and implementation of the FARMER SAP Master Agreement and any associated Allocation Agreements.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Air Pollution Control Officer is authorized and directed to take all steps necessary to carry out this resolution.

The Honorable Directors of the Air Pollution Control District Board of Siskiyou County, California, met in regular session this 25th day of April 2023; there being present Directors Ray Haupt, Ed Valenzuela, Michael N. Kobseff, Brandon Criss and Julianna Lucchesi, Deputy District Counsel Dana Barton and County Clerk and ex-Officio Clerk of the Air Pollution Control District Laura Bynum by Deputy County Clerk Wendy Winningham. Director Takeshi Murakami was absent.

The meeting was called to order by Chair Lucchesi. Director Valenzuela led in the salute to the flag of the United States of America.

Public Comment

There were no public comments received.

Air Pollution - Discussion and possible direction re update on Air Pollution Control District operations, including new staff members, grant program summary, Lower Klamath Dams Decommissioning Project and filling positions on the Air Pollution Control District Hearing Board. Presentation only.
