Siskiyou County Local Transportation Commission Social Services Transportation Advisory Council Bylaws

The Social Services Transportation Advisory Council (SSTAC) was established under the requirements of Public Utilities Code § 99238. The SSTAC serves as an advisory body to the Siskiyou County Local Transportation Commission (SCLTC) regarding the transit needs of residents of the Siskiyou region, including but not limited to transit dependent and transit disadvantaged persons such as the elderly, disabled, and persons of limited means.

The SSTAC shall be governed by the following bylaws.

A. Responsibilities

- 1. Advise the SCLTC on the following:
 - Transit needs of the general public (i.e., hours of service, new bus routes, shorter headways, etc.) including but not limited to transit dependent and transit disadvantaged persons such as the elderly, disabled, and persons of limited means.
 - ii. Coordination between transit service providers in the region.
 - iii. Identify potential connections for people walking or riding bikes to or from transit for consideration by the SCLTC.
 - iv. Other issues the membership believes are relevant to transit in the Siskiyou region.
- Annually participate in the identification of transit needs in the Siskiyou region, including unmet transit needs that may exist and may be reasonable to meet by establishing or contracting for new public transportation or specialized transportation services.
- 3. Annually review and recommend action by SCLTC which finds, by resolution, that:
 - i. There are no unmet transit needs;
 - ii. There are no unmet transit needs that are reasonable to meet;
 - iii. There are unmet transit needs, including needs that are reasonable to meet; and/or
 - iv. There are unmet transit needs that are not reasonable to meet.

B. Participants

- 1. SSTAC meeting participation shall include nine members per statutory guidelines (see Public Utilities Code Section 99238 below):
 - (a) One representative of potential transit users who is 60 years of age or older.
 - (b) One representative of potential transit users who is disabled.
 - (c) Two representatives of local social service providers for seniors, including one representative of a transportation provider.
 - (d) Two representatives of local social service providers for the disabled, including one representative of a transportation provider.
 - (e) One representative of a local social service provider for persons of limited means.
 - (f) Two representatives from the local consolidated transportation service agency, designated pursuant to subdivision (a) of Section 15975 of the Government Code, including one representative from an operator.

- (g) The Commission may appoint additional representatives, including representatives of residents walking and bicycling to/from transit, to participate at SSTAC meetings and serve as an alternate for any of the nine statutory members, if needed.
- 2. In appointing council members, SCLTC shall strive to attain geographic and minority representation among council members.

C. Term of Appointment

In accordance with the Transportation Development Act one-third of the initial appointments to the Council shall be for a one-year term, one-third shall be for a two-year term, and one-third shall be for a three-year term. Subsequent to the initial appointment, the term of appointment shall be for three years, which may be renewed for an additional three-year term.

D. <u>Vacancies</u>

- A vacancy shall be created when a member resigns; completes their term of appointment and does not wish to be reappointed; misses three consecutive regular meetings without good cause; or when a member can no longer carry out their responsibilities as a council member.
- 2. If a member resigns during their term the SCLTC Executive Director will post vacancy notices. Appointments will be brought before the SCLTC to fill any vacant position.
- 3. The SCLTC will appoint members pursuant to the Transportation Development Act.
- 4. All SSTAC positions shall be advertised, every three years, to either extend the tenure of current positions or appoint new members.

E. Duties

1. During the first meeting of the calendar year, the Council shall elect a Chair and Vice Chair to serve for one year or until the first meeting of the following calendar year. Upon resignation of an officer, a special election shall be held.

2. Officers

i. Chair:

- 1. The Chair shall preside over all SSTAC meetings. The Chair may appoint committees, conduct elections to fill the positions of Chair and Vice Chair, prepare and sign correspondence reflecting SSTAC votes, or input provided, and may delegate their responsibility to sign correspondence.
- 2. The Chair, or their designee, should approve the final unmet transit needs findings recommendation prior to staff presenting to the SCLTC.
- ii. Vice Chair: In the absence of the Chair, the Vice Chair shall perform the duties of the chair.
- iii. SCLTC Executive Director: The Executive Director, or their designee, shall prepare and post agendas, provide information and general assistance;

take meeting notes for all SSTAC meetings; prepare SSTAC letters and other correspondence, as requested by the Council; and prepare and distribute special notices, agenda announcements, staff reports and other materials, as directed by the Council or SCLTC management.

F. Organization and Procedures

- Meetings: The SSTAC shall meet at least twice per year, typically in March and September. Additional meetings may be convened at the request of the Executive Director or a member of the Council. The meetings shall be open to the public, in compliance with the Ralph M Brown Act. All meeting locations must be ADA accessible.
- 2. Quorum: A quorum shall exist if two-thirds (2/3) of the currently appointed council members are in attendance (in-person or remotely). A quorum must exist for the council to conduct any official business.
- 3. Voting: Actions of the Council will be taken by consensus of all members in attendance. If an item requires formal action, it shall be by voice vote unless a member requests a roll call vote. A passing vote requires two-thirds voting yes.
- 4. Limitation of Discussion: The Council will allow public comment of up to three minutes. In certain circumstances the Council can extend the time to five (5) minutes.
- 5. Conduct of Meetings: Meetings are generally to be conducted in accordance with the principles of Robert's Rules of Order.
- Meeting Notes: Meeting minutes recording the members and visitors present, motions entertained, and actions taken at each meeting shall be prepared by SCLTC staff, posted on the SCLTC website, and made available to the SCLTC after each SSTAC meeting.
- 7. Bylaws: These bylaws may be amended by a majority vote of the SSTAC members and subsequent approval by the SCLTC.
- 8. Communications: Official communications shall be in writing and shall be approved by a quorum of the SSTAC.
- 9. Staff Assistance: In addition to assistance from SCLTC staff, the SSTAC shall solicit technical assistance from Siskiyou Transit and General Express (STAGE) and relevant local agency staff regarding public transit and walking/bicycling access to public transit.

Subject: Review Unmet Transit Needs for FY 2024/2025

Past Action

The SSTAC last met on July 6, 2023, to review unmet transit needs requests for FY 2023/2024.

Background

On April 9, 2024, the SCLTC adopted Resolution No. 24-05 that defines the definitions of unmet transit needs and reasonable to meet for the FY 2024/2025 unmet transit needs review. A copy of the adopted resolution is included in the packet.

PUC § 99401.5 – Unmet Transit Needs Finding identifies the items the transportation planning agency shall do annually. These include:

- a) Consulting with the SSTAC.
- b) Identify the transit needs of the jurisdiction including the following:
 - 1. An annual assessment of the size and location of identifiable groups likely to be transit dependent or transit disadvantaged, including, but not limited to, the elderly, the disabled, including individuals eligible for paratransit and other special transportation services and persons of limited means, including, but not limited to, recipients under the CalWORKs program.
 - 2. An analysis of the adequacy of existing public transportation services and specialized transportation services, including privately and publicly provided services, in meeting the transit demand identified under paragraph 1 above.
 - An analysis of the potential alternative public transportation and specialized transportation services and service improvements that would meet all or part of the transit demand.
 - 4. An analysis of the need to acquire or lease vans and related equipment for a farmworker vanpool program. This analysis is only required, however, upon receipt by the transportation planning agency of a request from an interested party identifying a potential need.
- c) Identify the unmet transit needs of the jurisdiction and those needs that are reasonable to meet. The transportation planning agency shall hold at least one

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public hearing pursuant to Section 99238.5 for the purpose of soliciting comments on the unmet transit needs that may exist within the jurisdiction and that might be reasonable to meet by establishing or contracting for new public transportation or specialized transportation services or by expanding existing services. The definition adopted by the transportation planning agency for the terms "unmet transit needs" and "reasonable to meet" shall be documented by resolution or in the minutes of the agency. The fact that an identified transit need cannot be fully met based on available resources shall not be the sole reason for finding that a transit need is not reasonable to meet.

d) Adopt by resolution a finding for the jurisdiction, after consideration of all available information compiled pursuant to subdivisions (a), (b), and (c). The finding shall be that (1) there are no unmet transit needs, (2) there are no unmet transit needs that are reasonable to meet, or (3) there are unmet transit needs, including needs that are reasonable to meet. The resolution shall include information developed pursuant to subdivisions (a), (b), and (c) which provides the basis for the finding.

Representatives from STAGE will provide input on their efforts to address some of the unmet needs requests received this year and information on other requests to assist the Council with making the necessary recommendations.

Discussion

Resolution No. 24-05

Resolution Approving the Definitions of Unmet Transit Needs and Reasonable to Meet for FY 2024/2025

WHEREAS, the Transportation Development Act (TDA) requires each regional transportation planning agency to find, prior to making any allocation of Local Transportation Fund (LTF) monies for streets and roads, (1) that there are no unmet transit needs, or (2) that there are no unmet transit needs which can be reasonable met, or (3) if there are unmet transit needs, including some that are determined reasonable to meet, that they have been funded; and

WHEREAS, the TDA further permits the agency to define the terms "unmet transit needs" and "reasonable to meet" as it determines appropriate, consistent with PUC § 99401.5(c); and

WHEREAS, the Siskiyou County Local Transportation Commission hereby defines "Unmet Transit Needs" as travel by public transit for the following purposes:

- A population group in the proposed transit service area that has been defined and located which has no reliable, affordable, or accessible transportation for necessary trips. The size and location of the group must be such that a service to meet their needs is feasible within the definition of "reasonable to meet" as set forth below.
- 2) Trips made by the public, including elderly and handicapped, within the region to access the following services in order of priority:
 - a) To obtain non-emergency medical and health care services;
 - b) To attend school, college, or programs for functioning individuals, who are elderly or disabled by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA);
 - c) To obtain, maintain or prepare for employment, including vocational training, college and workshops teaching job search or employment skills;
 - d) To handle personal business such as financial services or shopping:
 - e) For religious, social, and recreational purposes.
- 3) Unmet Transit Needs specially exclude:
 - a) Minor operational improvements or changes, involving issues such as bus stops, schedules, and minor route changes;
 - b) Improvements funded or scheduled for implementation in the following fiscal year;
 - c) Primary and secondary school transportation.

WHEREAS, an unmet transit need that meets the definition above and meets all the following minimum criteria shall be considered reasonable to meet:

Minimum Requirements:

- 1) Proposed services can be proven operationally feasible;
- 2) Proposed services can demonstrate a farebox recovery ratio (fare revenue to operational cost) of fifteen (15) percent during the first twelve (12) months of operation and twenty-five (25) percent beginning with month thirteen (13) of operation;
- 3) Proposed services are consistent with the most recent Short Range Transit Plan:

4) Proposed transit services will benefit the public, with particular consideration for those who rely on public transportation, seniors, and disabled person, within the meaning of Title VI or other similar assessments.

Other Areas for Consideration:

- 5) Proposed services will not reduce the existing level of transit services;
- 6) Unless the proposed transit service is eligible for a two-year exemption period, it must not reduce the ability of the overall transit system service to meet minimum fare box return requirements as stated in the Transportation Development Act
- 7) The proposed expenditure shall not be used to support or establish a service in direct competition with an existing private service.
- 8) Proposed services shall, in all cases, be evaluated to coordinate with transit services currently provided, either publicly or privately.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the definitions set forth above shall govern SCLTC's determinations of unmet transit needs that are reasonable to meet pursuant to applicable TDA statues and regulations, and the resulting allocation of TDA funds by the SCLTC.
